sen-ek-ee-o ro-lee-AH-nus

Common Names: String of Pearls, String of Beads, String of Peas

Family: Asteraceae

Origin: South America, Asia

Growth: Trailing / Cascading

Light: Full sun

Foot Candles: 250+

Water: Let dry completely

Humidity: Not required

Temperature: 16°C - 40°C

Soil: Well draining cactus mix

Container: Pot with drainage

Nutrients: 7-7-7 Monthly

Propagation: Stem cuttings

Interiorscape Use: Desktop, trailing



Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

Common Issues: Variegated cultivar needs a lot of light to keep variegation. Prone to stretching. “Pearls” can sometimes revert to different shapes.

Comments: An extremely popular houseplant. Requires little maintenance and provides interesting foliage and flowers. Part of the “String of” plant collective.

Toxicity: Ingestion of large quantities of any part of the plant may cause minor illness like vomiting or diarrhea. Contact with the plant's juice or sap may cause skin irritation or rash.
