Typically known as 'Sansevieria trifasciata' but was recently moved into the genus Dracaena after DNA testing was done on the plant cells. **Toxicity:** Ingestion of large quantities can cause vomiting, depression, nausea, diarrhea, anorexia, hyper-salivation, and dilated pupils.
