
Phlebodium aureum

Comments: One of the few houseplants available with a blue colouration. If grown as a container houseplant: a drip line, 'plant-nanny' system, or self-watering planter with reservoir is recommended. Intermittent waterings can easily stress this fern. The underside of the fronds have golden scales that produce spores. Dies quickly with insufficient humidity.

Toxicity: Safe.
