sen-ek-ee-o pear-uh-gree-nus

Common Names: String of Dolphins, String of Seals

Family: Asteraceae

Origin: South America, Asia

Growth: Trailing / cascading

Light: Full sun

Foot Candles: 250+

Water: Let dry completely

Humidity: Not required

Temperature: 16°C - 40°C

Soil: Well draining cactus mix

Container: Pot with drainage

Nutrients: 7-7-7 Monthly

Propagation: Stem cuttings

Interiorscape Use: Reception,
employee personal plant



Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids,
Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

Common Issues: The dolphin shape can sometimes revert back to a flatter leaf.

Comments: A rare addition to the “String of” plant collection. Features tiny little dolphin shaped leaves. The plant grows similar to string of pearls and has the same care requirements.

Toxicity: Ingestion of any part of plant may cause minor illness like vomiting or diarrhea. Contact with the plant's juice or sap may cause skin irritation or rash.
