## **Caryota mitis**

**Common Name: Fishtail Palm** 

Family: Arecaceae Origin: Tropical Asia

**Growth:** Upwards, clumping **Light:** Full sun, tolerates lower

Foot Candles: 250+ Water: Keep moist Humidity: 50% - 90%

**Temperature:** 18°C - 29°C **Soil:** Well draining potting mix

Container: Self-watering planter, irrigated bed

Nutrients: 10-10-10 Monthly

Propagation: Seed or removal of offsets

Interiorscape Use: Large potted plant, atriums

Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

Common Issues: Root rot if sitting in water. Can suffer transplant shock and drop

some of its fronds.

**Comments:** The Fishtail Palm very rarely produces fruit when grown indoors. Acclimates well to indoor environments and can grow quickly in the right conditions. Very interesting palm frond unique to the Caryota mitis.

**Toxicity:** The berries produced by this palm are poisonous. Will cause severe pain in the mouth if eaten. Burning and swelling of lips, mouth, tongue, and throat; difficulty of speaking. Handling berries will also cause redness and swelling of skin and eyes.
