Common Names: Pocketbook Flower, Lady's Purse, Slipper Flower, Slipperwort, Pouch Plant, Poor Man's Orchid

Family: Calceolariaceae

Origin: Chile & Argentina

Growth: Clumping

Light: Bright, indirect

Foot Candles: 100 - 200

Water: Let dry out partially

Humidity: 30% - 50%

Temperature: 5°C - 21°C

Soil: Regular potting mix

Container: Self-watering planter

Nutrients: 10-20-10 when blooming

Propagation: Seed, tissue culture

Interiorscape Use: Seasonal colour



Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

Common Issues: Difficult to re-bloom and are often replaced after flowers are spent.

Comments: Prefers slightly colder temperature conditions to encourage blooms. Used as a replaceable plant in interiorscape and sometimes in cut flower arrangements. Very unique flower that comes in a variety of colours and patterns.

Toxicity: Safe.
