bundles; these ties can eventually cut into the plants skin as it matures.

Comments: Despite its many common names, this plant is not a true bamboo at all. The plant is easy to manipulate and can be found sold in a variety of shapes. It is important to remember that the plant will not continue this growth habit when you bring it home; a spiral plant will not continue to spiral. Dracaena sanderiana is an excellent plant to place in an aquarium filter to aid in removing nitrogen from the fish waste.
