pol-ISS-see-as froo-tih-KOH-suh

Common Names: Ming Aralia

Family: Araliaceae

Origin: Central Malaysia

Height: 4" pot = 10" Specimen = 30'

Light: Bright, indirect

Foot Candles: 175 - 225

Water: Let dry partially before watering

Humidity: 40%+

Temperature: 16°C - 28°C

Soil: Well draining potting mix

Container: Self-watering planter, pot with drainage

Nutrients: 10-10-10 Monthly

Propagation: Cuttings

Interiorscape Use: Exotic foliage, bonsai



Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

Common Issues: Root rot when overwatered. Pruning keeps it compact.

Comments: This plant features beautiful leaves on rugged bark and will grow in a small clump. Can be trained to be a small forest bonsai or grown as a large specimen for interiorscapes.

Toxicity: Safe.
