

# Fenestraria rhopalophylla

fen-es-TRAY-ree-uh rope-a-lo-FIL-la

**Common Names:** Baby Toes, Pebble Plant, Living Stone

**Family:** Aizoaceae

**Origin:** Southern Africa

**Growth:** Splitting, clumping

**Light:** Full sun

**Foot Candles:** 250+

**Water:** Let dry completely. Plant should wrinkle very slightly to indicate it needs water.

**Humidity:** Not required

**Temperature:** 18°C - 26°C

**Soil:** Extremely well draining cactus mix

**Container:** Pot with drainage

**Nutrients:** 7-7-7 only in Spring

**Propagation:** Seed

**Interiorscape Use:** Novelty, desktop plant



**Common Pests:** Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

**Common Issues:** Overwatering can easily occur, as the plant never developed the genetics to stop the intake of water when it has reached capacity, resulting in the plant literally popping like a balloon from too much water being pulled into the tissue. Also susceptible to popping from being poked with sharp fingernails.

**Comments:** An adorable little succulent with a clumping habit. The plant might even surprise you with a daisy-like flower!

**Toxicity:** Safe.
