

Yucca guatemalensis

YUK-uh gwa-teh-mah-LEN-sis

Common Names: Spineless Yucca,
Adams Needle

Family: Asparagaceae
Origin: Tropical Americas

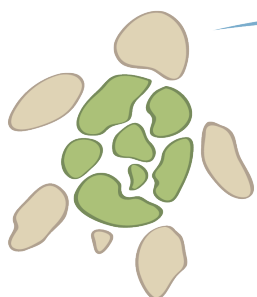
Growth: Upwards, bushy
Light: Bright, filtered
Foot Candles: 50 - 250
Water: Let dry partially
Humidity: Not required
Temperature: 12°C - 25°C
Soil: Regular potting mix
Container: Planter with drainage
Nutrients: 10-10-10 Monthly
Propagation: Stem cuttings
Interiorscape Use: Low maintenance

Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale,
Thrips.

Common Issues: Root rot if sitting in water. Cold drafts cause
brown tips, full-sun can scorch leaves.

Comments: Easy to care for with unique shape and large trunk.

Toxicity: Moderately poisonous, if large amounts of the plant are consumed. The
poisonous elements are present in the innermost parts of the plant. May cause
vomiting.
