Common Names: Dwarf Umbrella Tree, Australian Ivy Palm, Parasol Plant, Hawaiian Umbrella Tree.

Family: Araliaceae

Origin: South-East Asia, Australia

Height: 4" pot = 6" Specimen = 8'

Light: Low - medium

Foot Candles: 50 - 150

Water: Let dry partially

Humidity: 30% - 60%

Temperature: 14°C - 28°C

Soil: Regular potting mix

Container: Self-watering planter, living wall

Nutrients: 10-10-10 Monthly

Propagation: Seed or cuttings

Interiorscape Use: Living walls, filler plant, employee personal plant

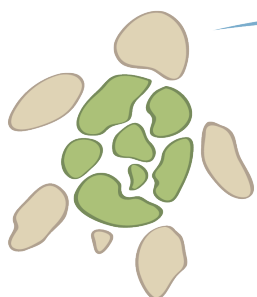


Common Pests: Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

Common Issues: Root rot when sitting in water.

Comments: One of the most common indoor plants but also commonly used as a landscape plant in tropical climates. The three most common cultivars are 'Dazzle', 'Gold Capella', and 'Trinette'.

Toxicity: The leaves are moderately poisonous when ingested by humans, cats, and dogs. Symptoms include difficulty swallowing, irritation and burning in the mouth and throat, drooling, and vomiting.
