

# Syngonium podophyllum

sin-GO-nee-um po-do-FIL-um

**Common Names:** Arrowhead Vine, African Evergreen, Goosefoot Vine

**Family:** Araceae

**Origin:** Mexico to Ecuador

**Growth:** Vining

**Light:** Bright, indirect

**Foot Candles:** 100 - 250

**Water:** Let top inch of soil dry

**Humidity:** 30% - 70%

**Temperature:** 15°C - 30°C

**Soil:** Regular potting mix

**Container:** Self-watering planter

**Nutrients:** 10-10-10 Monthly

**Propagation:** Stem cuttings

**Interiorscape Use:** Attractive low-maintenance foliage



**Common Pests:** Mealybugs, Aphids, Spider Mites, Scale, Thrips.

**Common Issues:** Dry air can brown the leaves.

**Comments:** A low maintenance plant that comes in a variety of colours. Can be grown as a trailing plant or trained up a totem. Syngonium is synonymous with Nephytis. Often mistaken for Caladium.

**Toxicity:** Ingestion of large quantities may cause oral irritation, pain and swelling of mouth, tongue, and lips, excessive drooling, vomiting, and difficulty swallowing.
